



**Minutes of the Rowney Green Association AGM and Ordinary Meeting  
Held on Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> May 2019**

**AGM**

Thanks were expressed to Stevie and Nick Prosser for taking over distribution of the Welcome Pack and Village Map from Claire Kenny. All villagers now have a laminated copy of the map and it is also available from the RG website. Michael Corfield has developed the type and range of information on the RGA section of the website. The Neighbourhood plan was formally adopted by 97% of residents, for which some RGA members were significantly involved. The speed limit on The Holloway was reduced from 40mph to 30 mph. Thanks also to Katie Hearndon Fellows (PCSO) and County Councillor Charlie Hotham for their involvement and advice.

It was agreed that membership fees should remain at the same level for the next year; £4 a year per household or £10 for three years.

The current chairman and executive committee were re-elected for 2019/20.

**General Meeting (key issues only)**

**May Day celebrations**

May Day celebrations again a great success, including the history display. Agreed that a focussed effort required to review and catalogue all material, and then consider digitising and adding to village website. RG History Group to be reconvened for this purpose including Andrew, Brian, Michael and Dorothy. **Planning**

John Cypher's written report noted the importance of the recently approved Neighbourhood Plan which was recently referred to by the Planning Inspector in turning down a proposed housing development. John will continue to update us on local developments.

New Neighbourhood Watch signs had been received and suitable locations for their placement are being sought. No new issues to report.

**Grit bins**

A new (grey) grit bin has been bought, which the Parish Council has responsibility for filling. Anticipated it will be situated at the top of Chapel Lane.
